Chapter 63

RESOLVE in Favor of the Town of East Millinocket.

Town of East Millinocket; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of the town of East Millinocket, the sum of \$584.33 which represents the amount paid by said town to the Bangor State Hospital for the infirmary care of Eugene Harmon at that institution from April 1, 1947 to May 13, 1948; said sum to be taken from the general fund of the state.

Chapter 64

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Whetstone Pond, in the County of Piscataquis.

Regulating fishing in Whetstone pond in the county of Piscataquis. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Whetstone pond or Sylvan lake in the towns of Blanchard and Kingsbury, in the county of Piscataquis, and all tributaries thereto to the dipping of smelts.

Effective August 6, 1949

Chapter 65

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Porter Lake.

Regulating fishing in Porter lake. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Porter lake in the county of Franklin to all fishing except fly fishing and trolling with the daily bag limit of 4 trout, salmon or togue, and closing the tributaries to the dipping of smelts.

Effective August 6, 1949
