Chapter 77

RESOLVE Authorizing Town of Harpswell to Fill Certain Waters for Road.

Town of Harpswell authorized to fill certain waters. Resolved: That the selectmen of the town of Harpswell be, and hereby are, authorized to fill in the waters between Dingley Island and Great Island for the purpose of constructing a road between said points and thus eliminate the necessity of building a bridge.

Chapter 78

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Mayfield Pond in the County of Somerset.

Regulating fishing in Mayfield pond in the county of Somerset. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Mayfield pond in Brighton plantation and Mayfield township, in the county of Somerset, to fishing through the ice for pickerel, hornpout, white perch, yellow perch, eels, cusk, chubs and smelts from the time ice forms in the fall until it goes out in the spring and for all fish except bass during February, March and April.

Chapter 79

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Sand Pond in the County of Oxford.

Regulating fishing in Sand pond in the county of Oxford. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Sand pond in the town of Denmark in the county of Oxford to ice fishing, and establishing a daily limit of 3 bass per day with the minimum length of 12 inches, taken in open season.
