RESOLVES, 1949**CHAP. 132**

to the town of Chelsea in settlement of the claim against the state for the state's share of snow removal expense incurred during 1947 and 1948.

Chapter 130

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Dedham.

Town of Dedham; interest charged off. **Resolved:** That the treasurer of state be, and hereby is, authorized to charge off the sum of \$347.55, interest on state taxes, now charged against the town of Dedham for the years 1944 to 1947, inclusive.

Chapter 131

RESOLVE, Relating to Unexpended Balances for Lobster Rearing Station.

Unexpended balances for lobster rearing station. **Resolved:** All unexpended balances of moneys appropriated under the provisions of chapter 90 of the resolves of 1941 for the purpose of establishing a lobster hatchery and rearing station for the propagation of lobsters shall lapse and be credited to the general fund; and be it further

Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to sell any equipment that has been obtained for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of chapter 90 of the resolves of 1941 and which cannot be used advantageously by the department of sea and shore fisheries; the net proceeds of such selling after the deduction of the cost of selling shall be credited to the general fund.

Chapter 132

RESOLVE, in Favor of Caswell Plantation.

Caswell Plantation; settlement of claim. **Resolved:** That the treasurer of state be, and hereby is, authorized to accept the sum of \$6,700 from Caswell Plantation in final and full settlement of the amount owed the state by Caswell Plantation for the board and care of state wards.
