Chapter 191

RESOLVE, in Favor of Joseph M. Martin of Van Buren.

Joseph M. Martin; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$250 to be paid to Joseph M. Martin of Van Buren, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for poultry killed by foxes; said sum to be paid from the dog tax fund.

Effective August 6, 1949

Chapter 192

RESOLVE, in Favor of Hatches, Inc., of Belgrade.

Hatches, Inc.; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$163 to be paid to Hatches, Inc., of Belgrade, as a full and final settlement for its claim against the state for poultry killed by foxes; said sum to be paid from the dog tax fund.

Effective August 6, 1949

Chapter 193

RESOLVE, in Favor of George V. Jordan, of North Waldoboro.

George V. Jordon; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$344.53 from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game to be paid to George V. Jordon, of North Waldoboro, as a full and final settlement of his claim against the state for damage to his car by a deer.

Chapter 194

RESOLVE, Providing Pensions for Soldiers and Sailors and Dependents and Other Needy Persons.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the cost of living has increased greatly, and

Whereas, the people receiving aid from the state must have more assistance immediately in order to maintain themselves, and
