PRIVATE AND SPECIAL, 1959

Chapter 65

AN ACT Repealing the Incorporation of the Officers and Members of Lafayette Lodge.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1865, c. 523, repealed. Chapter 523 of the private and special laws of 1865, as amended by chapter 17 of the private and special laws of 1947, is repealed.

Chapter 66

AN ACT Relating to Speed of Motor Vehicles on the Maine Turnpike.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1941, c. 69, § 11, sub-§ (b), amended. Subsection (b) of section 11 of chapter 69 of the private and special laws of 1941 is amended to read as follows:

'(b) The authority may by regulation prescribe a maximum limitation on the speed of vehicles using said turnpike, but not exceeding 70 miles per hour, and so limit at any point or place thereon, and is empowered to regulate the volume and weight of vehicles admitted to the turnpike.'

Chapter 67

AN ACT Relating to Powers of the Hancock County Trustees of Public Reservations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1903, c. 369, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 369 of the private and special laws of 1903, as amended by chapter 33 of the private and special laws of 1949, is further amended by adding at the end a new sentence, to read as follows:

'Said corporation shall have the further power to convey by donation or otherwise lands in said Hancock County heretofore acquired as aforesaid, to the United States of America for the use, extension and improvement of Acadia National Park.'
