Chapter 18

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Moosehead Lake, Piscataquis County.

Moosehead Lake; fishing regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing to ice fishing that part of Moosehead Lake from the mouth of Williams Brook in Big W. Township to a straight line between 2 yellow posts, one set on the land of Hermon Brautigam on the south shore of Williams Cove and the other in a northeasterly direction on the opposite shore, Piscataquis County.

Effective September 12, 1959

Chapter 19

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Sawyer Pond, Piscataquis County.

Fishing in Sawyer Pond; regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation prohibiting the use or possession of live fish as bait and establishing a 5 trout daily bag limit in Sawyer Pond, Greenville Twp., Piscataquis County.

Effective September 12, 1959

Chapter 20

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in the West Branch of Pleasant River, Piscataquis County.

Fishing in the West Branch of Pleasant River; regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening the West Branch of the Pleasant River in Piscataquis County to fishing under the general law, except there shall be a daily bag limit of 10 trout in that portion of the river from the Gulf Hagus to First West Branch Pond.

Effective September 12, 1959

Chapter 21

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Lily Lake, Washington County.

Fishing in Lily Lake regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing a daily bag limit of 5 trout and prohibiting the use or possession of live fish as bait on Lily Lake, in Trescott, Washington County.
