Chapter 132

AN ACT Repealing Law Enabling School District Number One in Gorham to Hold Trust Funds for Educational Purposes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1889, c. 461, repealed. Chapter 461 of the private and special laws of 1889 is repealed.

Chapter 133

AN ACT Relating to Superintending School Committee of Town of Gorham.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Superintending school committee. The Town of Gorham may increase the membership of the superintending school committee to 5 members.

The Town of Gorham may choose by ballot at its annual town meeting 3 additional superintending school committee members to serve with the 2 members already in office, and shall fill vacancies arising therein at each subsequent annual town meeting.

The 3 members thus chosen shall designate by lot one member to serve 2 years and the other 2 members to serve 3 years; and they shall certify such designation to the town clerk to be by him recorded; and thereafter the members shall be chosen by ballot at the annual meeting of the Town of Gorham to hold office for 3 years. Said committee may fill vacancies occurring between annual meetings, and the term of office of any member of the committee so chosen shall expire at the next annual meeting.

A vote of a majority of the full membership of the committee shall be required for the purpose of conducting business and exercising the powers of the committee and for all other purposes.

No member of the superintending school committee shall be employed as a teacher in any public school or contract high school or academy located within this supervisory union. In case any member of the superintending school committee shall remove from the town or be absent for more than 90 days, a vacancy shall be declared to exist and the remaining members shall, within 30 days thereafter, choose another member as hereinbefore provided.
