CHAP. 10

Chapter 7

RESOLVE, Regulating Salmon Fishing in Sebec Lake, Piscataquis County.

Sebec Lake; regulating salmon fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation reducing in a period of 4 years, beginning September 1, 1961 and ending September 1, 1965, the size limit on salmon taken in Sebec Lake, Piscataquis County, from 14 inches in length to 12 inches in length, with a day limit of 5 fish.

Effective September 16, 1961

Chapter 8

RESOLVE, Regulating Ice Fishing in Spring Lake, T3 R4, Somerset County.

Ice Fishing in Spring Lake, regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Spring Lake, T₃ R₄, Somerset County, to ice fishing from February 1st to March 31st each year and also prohibiting the use or possession of live fish as bait.

Effective September 16, 1961

Chapter 9

RESOLVE, Designating Bridge over Outlet Stream, Oxford Village, as Ralph E. Edwards Bridge.

Bridge over Outlet Stream, Oxford Village; designated. Resolved: That the bridge on Main Street, Oxford Village, Oxford County, over Outlet Stream, and next to the woolen mill, be designated as the Ralph E. Edwards Bridge.

Effective September 16, 1961

Chapter 10

RESOLVE, Designating Certain Waters in Porter as "Black Lake."

Certain waters in Porter designated. Resolved: That the waters held by the dam constructed during 1960 in Week's Meadow in the Town of Porter, Oxford County, by the Saddleback Rod and Gun Club, of Kezar Falls, be officially named and referred to as "Black Lake."
