RESOLVES, 1961**CHAP. 85**

Limerick, one Representative; Hollis and Buxton, one Representative; Lyman, Dayton, Arundel and Alfred, one Representative; Acton, Newfield, Waterboro and Shapleigh, one Representative.

Effective September 16, 1961

Chapter 82

RESOLVE, in Favor of Wayne Innis of Bath.

Money appropriated to Wayne Innis. Resolved: That there be appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$272 to be paid to Wayne Innis of Bath as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State for head injuries sustained by his son in January, 1960, caused by a child residing at the Military and Naval Children's Home, which child is under guardianship of the Department of Mental Health and Corrections.

Effective September 16, 1961

Chapter 83

RESOLVE, Increasing Pension of Maurice Albert of Madawaska.

Maurice Albert; pension increased. Resolved: That a pension of \$30 per month is granted to Maurice Albert, of Madawaska, to be paid monthly from the appropriation for special legislative pensions. Such pension shall begin on July 1, 1961 and continue until otherwise provided by the Legislature.

That part of the resolves of 1953, chapter 94, which provided for a state pension for Maurice Albert, of Madawaska, is repealed.

Chapter 84

RESOLVE, Providing for State Pension for Clyde P. Walker of Stratton.

Clyde P. Walker; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$25 per month is granted to Clyde P. Walker, of Stratton, to be paid monthly from the appropriation for special legislative pensions. Such pension shall begin July 1, 1961 and continue until otherwise provided by the Legislature.

Chapter 85

RESOLVE, in Favor of Charles A. Dean Memorial Hospital of Greenville.

Charles A. Dean Memorial Hospital; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum

of \$160.57 to be paid to the Charles A. Dean Memorial Hospital of Greenville, Piscataquis County, for hospitalization for Anthony Tomah, a Passamaquoddy Indian, Angus Morey of Shirley Mills and Henrietta Lawler, an unsettled person.

Effective September 16, 1961

Chapter 86

Resolve, to Reimburse the Town of Limestone for 1958 Connor Poll Taxes Paid the State.

Town of Limestone; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$324 to be paid to the Town of Limestone as a full and final claim against the State for poll taxes collected by the State from residents of Connor in 1958.

Effective September 16, 1961

Chapter 87

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Edward M. Healy for Repairs to Androscoggin Lake Dam.

Edward M. Healy; reimbursed. Resolved: That the sum of \$200.70 be appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to be paid to Edward M. Healy for repairs to Androscoggin Lake Dam on the Dead River in Leeds.

Effective September 16, 1961

Chapter 88

RESOLVE, to Increase Retirement Benefit for Chaplain T. Greene of Princeton.

Chaplain T. Greene; retirement benefit increased. Resolved: That the retirement benefit now being paid to Chaplain T. Greene, of Princeton, under chapter 63-A of the Revised Statutes be increased to \$25 per month effective as of January 1, 1961.

Chapter 89

RESOLVE, to Increase Retirement Benefit for Susie H. Yeaton, of Harrington.

Retirement benefit of Susie H. Yeaton; increased. Resolved: That the retirement benefit now being paid to Susie H. Yeaton, of Harrington, under the
