PUBLIC LAWS, 1963

and occupied therewith, or breaks and enters any office, bank, shop, store, warehouse, barn, stable, vessel, railroad car of any kind, courthouse, jail, meetinghouse, college, academy or other building for public use or in which valuable things are kept, and commits larceny therein, shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than \pm year nor more than 15 years; and when the offense is committed in the daytime, by imprisonment for not more than 6 years or by a fine of not more than \$1,000 by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment for not more than 6 years.'

Chapter 22

AN ACT Relating to Certificates for Female Dogs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 100, § 10, amended. The 2nd sentence of the 2nd paragraph of section 10 of chapter 100 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'All female dogs shall be considered capable of producing young unless a certificate issued by the Commissioner of Agriculture and signed by a any licensed veterinarian, or any previous license record, is presented from a licensed veterinarian stating that such female was made incapable of bearing young by spaying by him.'

Chapter 23

AN ACT Classifying Card Brook in Ellsworth.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 15, amended. Subsection X under the caption "Coastal Streams" of section 15 of chapter 79 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 7 of chapter 426 of the public laws of 1955, is amended to read as follows:

'X. Card Brook, main stem, in Ellsworth from the farm pond about 250 yards west of U. S. highway No. 1 to tidewater – Class \oplus B-2.'
