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and occupied therewith, or breaks and enters any office, bank, shop, store, warehouse, barn, stable, vessel, railroad car of any kind, courthouse, jail, meeting-house, college, academy or other building for public use or in which valuable things are kept, and commits larceny therein, shall be punished by imprisonment for not ~~less than 1 year nor~~ more than 15 years; and when the offense is committed in the daytime, ~~by imprisonment for not more than 6 years or by a fine of not more than \$1,000~~ by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment for not more than 6 years.'

## Chapter 22

### AN ACT Relating to Certificates for Female Dogs.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**R. S., c. 100, § 10, amended.** The 2nd sentence of the 2nd paragraph of section 10 of chapter 100 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'All female dogs shall be considered capable of producing young unless a certificate issued by ~~the Commissioner of Agriculture and signed by a~~ any licensed veterinarian, or any previous license record, is presented from a licensed veterinarian stating that such female was made incapable of bearing young by spaying by him.'

## Chapter 23

### AN ACT Classifying Card Brook in Ellsworth.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**R. S., c. 79, § 15, amended.** Subsection X under the caption "Coastal Streams" of section 15 of chapter 79 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 7 of chapter 426 of the public laws of 1955, is amended to read as follows:

'X. Card Brook, main stem, in Ellsworth from the farm pond about 250 yards west of U. S. highway No. 1 to tidewater — Class ~~D~~ B-2.'
