Chapter 134

AN ACT Repealing Law Requiring Clerk of Courts to Mail Divorce Judgments When Duty to Support.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 166, § 70-A, repealed. Section 70-A of chapter 166 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 6 of chapter 75 of the public laws of 1959 and as amended by chapter 13 of the public laws of 1961, is repealed.

Chapter 135

AN ACT Relating to Underwater Swimming and Diving.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 36-A, § 10-A, additional. Chapter 36-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 349 of the public laws of 1959, is amended by adding a new section 10-A, to read as follows:

‘Sec. 10-A. Underwater swimming and diving.

I. Location to be marked. No person shall engage in underwater swimming or diving using a self contained underwater breathing apparatus or other artificial breathing device in any state or federal water without marking his position with a clearly discernible flag, buoy or other device which the commissioner approves or prescribes. No person when so engaged shall surface more than 100 feet from such marker, except in cases of emergency.

II. Operation near marker regulated. Any person operating a vessel within 100 feet of a device marking the location of an underwater swimmer or diver shall proceed with extreme caution. No person shall cause any person on water skis to pass within 100 feet of any such marking device.’

Chapter 136

AN ACT Relating to Open Season for Fishing in Fish River, Aroostook County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 44, sub-§ IV, amended. Subsection IV of section 44 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended to read as follows:
