Chapter 361

AN ACT Relating to Disability Retirement for State Employees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 63-A, § 7, sub-§ I, ¶ C, additional. Subsection I of section 7 of chapter 63-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 417 of the public laws of 1955 and as amended, is further amended by adding a new paragraph C, to read as follows:

‘C. Any person who attains age 60 while a recipient of a disability retirement allowance in accordance with paragraph A shall be entitled to a recomputation of benefits as provided in section 6 and shall be paid that amount which is greater. Further, if the amount of the service retirement allowance is greater than that being paid as the ordinary disability retirement allowance, the recipient shall no longer be considered as receiving a disability retirement allowance.’

Chapter 362

AN ACT Establishing the Uniform Commercial Code.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 190, additional. The Revised Statutes are amended by adding a new chapter, to be numbered chapter 190, to read as follows:

‘Chapter 190.

Uniform Commercial Code.
