SCHOOL COMMITTEE OF MILO

PRIVATE AND SPECIAL, 1963

Wheever violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$300, or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both, and in addition by a fine of \$5 for every 100 scallops or part thereof involved'

Chapter 28

AN ACT Relating to Taking of Smelts from Chandler River, Washington County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1959, c. 155, § 114, amended. The first paragraph of section 114 of chapter 155 of the private and special laws of 1959, as repealed and replaced by chapter 47 of the private and special laws of 1961, is amended to read as follows:

'Smelts may be taken from the tidal waters of the Towns of Addison, Columbia Falls, Cherryfield, Harrington, Milbridge and Steuben and from that part of Chandler River located in the Town of Jonesboro, all in the County of Washington, in the following manner: By hook and line, gill nets, hand dip nets, brush weirs and bag nets, from March 15th to April 30th of each year.'

Chapter 29

AN ACT Increasing Compensation of Trustees of Mexico Water District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1929, c. 102, § 8, amended. The next to the last sentence of section 8 of chapter 102 of the private and special laws of 1929 is amended to read as follows:

'Each member shall receive in full compensation for his services an allowance of fifty dollar \$200 per annum year.'

Chapter 30

AN ACT Increasing Number of Superintending School Committee of Town of Milo.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after the adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and
