PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE

As Passed by the One Hundred and First Legislature

1963

Commencing at a granite monument, being the southeast corner of the Town of Mapleton and the northeast corner of the Town of Chapman; thence proceeding in an easterly direction along a line with a true bearing of North ninety degrees East (N 90° E) until said line intersects the center line of the Center Line Road in the City of Presque Isle; thence proceeding in a northerly direction along the center line of said Center Line Road until the projection of said center line intersects the high water line on the south side of the Aroostook River; thence proceeding in a northwesterly direction along the high water line on the south side of the Aroostook River to its intersection with a true east-west line said line being "y" coordinate One million forty-eight thousand five hundred (1,048,500.00) on the Maine Transverse Mercator System (East Zone); thence proceeding westerly along said "y" coordinate line to its intersection with the east line of the Town of Mapleton; thence proceeding southerly along the said east line of the Town of Mapleton to the southeast corner of the Town of Mapleton and the place of beginning; are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of Presque Isle Water District for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of said district with pure water for domestic, sanitary, commercial and municipal purposes.

Provided, however, that it shall not construct any system of pipe lines or development, without first having submitted its plans to the Public Utilities Commission, and obtained its advice therefor in writing, under power vested in said commission by section 13 of chapter ~~62~~ 44 of the Revised Statutes of ~~1930~~ 1954.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1941, c. 67, § 13, amended. The first sentence of section 13 of chapter 67 of the private and special laws of 1941 is amended to read as follows:

'All individuals, firms and corporations, whether private, public or municipal, shall pay to the treasurer of said district the rates established by said board of trustees for the water used by them, and said rates shall be uniform within the territory supplied by the district, unless otherwise established by said board of trustees, to apply to that part of the additional area described in section 1 which constitutes the Presque Isle Air Base Property, so called, and subject to approval of the Public Utilities Commission.'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 51

AN ACT Relating to Incorporation of Maine Hereford Association.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Maine Hereford Association, authority to use same name. The Maine Hereford Association is granted the authority to use the same name whenever it incorporates under the general law as a nonprofit organization.

Sec. 2. Effective date. This act shall become null and void unless the incorporation is organized within 3 months after the effective date of this act.

Chapter 52

AN ACT to Amend the Charter of the Oxford Water District Relative to Rates.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, a section of the Town of Oxford within the territory of the Oxford Water District is served by a water main now owned by the inhabitants of the Town of Oxford and supplied from the Norway Water District; and

Whereas, the inhabitants of Oxford are authorized to convey said system, to the Oxford Water District and the Oxford Water District is authorized to receive and operate said system; and

Whereas, such transfer cannot be effected until the rates for service within such section may be different from the rates in the remainder of the district's territory; and

Whereas, it is in the best interests of the inhabitants of the district and the inhabitants of the Town of Oxford, who are one and the same, for such transfer to be effected as soon as possible; and

Whereas, acts and resolves do not become effective until 90 days after the Legislature adjourns unless passed as emergency measures; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1961, c. 41, § 12, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 12 of chapter 41 of the private and special laws of 1961 is amended to read as follows: 'Said rates shall be uniform within the territory supplied by the district ~~and~~, except that section of the territory which takes its supply from Norway Water District and the rates therein shall be uniform. All rates shall be subject to the approval of the Public Utilities Commission.'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.
