Sec. 2. R. S., T. 34, § 2333, amended. The last paragraph of section 2333 of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Such a certificate, upon endorsement for such purpose by a judge of probate, the District Court Judge or complaint justice within whose jurisdiction the individual is present, or by a Justice of the Superior Court, shall authorize any health or police officer to take the individual into custody and transport him to a hospital as designated in the application.'

AN ACT Relating to Adequate Brakes on Truck Tractors and Semitrailers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 1652, amended. The last sentence of section 1652 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'All trucks and combinations of truck tractor and semitrailer with 4 or more axles shall have adequate brakes on the wheels of all axles; except that this sentence shall not apply if the vehicle is in compliance with Interstate Commerce Commission safety regulations.'
