5. Regulations. To make such joint regulations as may be incidental to the foregoing and not inconsistent thereto and as may be necessary to effectuate the above mentioned powers.'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 464

AN ACT Relating to Branding of Potatoes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 7, § 952, amended. The first sentence of section 952 of Title 7 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 3 of chapter 219 of the public laws of 1965, is amended to read as follows:

'It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association, organization or corporation, or agent, representative or assistant to any person, firm, association, organization or corporation to expose for sale, or sell, at wholesale or retail, to ship, deliver or consign or have in possession potatoes prepared for market unless in containers which have been legibly and conspicuously tagged, branded, labeled or stenciled with the name and address of the person or persons responsible for packing and the name of the grade, net weight and the word "potatoes."'

Chapter 465

AN ACT Establishing Legislative Finance Office as Secretariat for Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 3, § 163, sub-§ 15, amended. Subsection 15 of section 163 of Title 3 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 341 and by section 2-D of chapter 425, both of the public laws of 1965, is further amended by adding at the end, a new paragraph, as follows:

'The Office of Legislative Finance Officer shall serve as the secretariat of the Joint Legislative Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs.'
