Chapter 85

AN ACT to Extend the Charter of the R. and T. Cement Railroad Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Extension of powers. The charter of the R. and T. Cement Railroad Company, as granted by the private and special laws of 1959, chapter 88; and extended by the private and special laws of 1961, chapter 39; and further extended by the private and special laws of 1963, chapter 104; is further revived, renewed and extended for a period of 2 years.

Chapter 86

AN ACT Increasing the Compensation of the Trustees of the Portland Water District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1907, c. 433, § 10, amended. The next to the last sentence of section 10 of chapter 433 of the private and special laws of 1907 is amended to read as follows:

'Each member shall receive in full compensation for his services an allowance of four hundred dollars \$800 per annum.'

Chapter 87

AN ACT Creating the Newport Water District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. Territorial limits; corporate name; purposes. Subject to the provisions of section 17 hereof, the inhabitants and territory of the Town of Newport in the County of Penobscot, shall constitute a body politic and corporate under the name of Newport Water District for the purpose of supplying said Town of Newport, and the inhabitants of said district, with pure water for domestic, sanitary, commercial and municipal purposes.
- Sec. 2. Source of supply. The said water district, for the purposes of its incorporation, is hereby authorized to take, collect, store, hold, divert, use, flow,
