respective county treasuries, together with such incidental expenses as may be necessary for the proper enforcement of said laws; bills for which shall be audited as provided in Title 15, section 1902. Such full-time deputy sheriffs shall not receive more than \$93 \$112 in the aggregate for any one week, except that this limitation shall not apply to Cumberland County and York County.

Chapter 277

AN ACT Relating to Duties of Deputy County Treasurer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 651, amended. Section 651 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end, a new sentence, to read as follows:

The deputy treasurer shall act as treasurer in the event of a vacancy until a treasurer is chosen in accordance with section 601.

Chapter 278

AN ACT Relating to Annual Postaudit for Municipalities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 30, § 5253, amended. Section 5253 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended by inserting after the first sentence the following new sentence:

The officers shall notify the State Auditor of the name and address of the auditor elected or engaged within 30 days after his election or engagement.

- Sec. 2. R. S., T. 30, § 5253, sub-§ 3, ¶ C, additional. Subsection 3 of section 5253 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new paragraph C, to read as follows:
- C. The failure of an auditor to file any of the copies required by paragraph B shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.
