Chapter 460

AN ACT Providing Funds for Support of Civil Air Patrol.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 6, § 46, additional. Title 6 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 46, to read as follows:

§ 46. Civil Air Patrol

The commission (Aeronautics) shall allocate and supervise any funds made available by the Legislature to the Civil Air Patrol, which patrol shall expend such funds as in its best judgment would most effectively carry out its purposes and objectives.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Aeronautics Commission the sum of \$5,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1968 and the sum of \$5,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1969 to carry out the purpose of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:

Chapter 461

AN ACT Relating to Accreditation of Elementary Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 20, § 916, additional. Title 20 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 916, to read as follows:

§ 916. Accreditation of elementary schools

Any approved elementary school unit may apply to the commissioner for recognition as an accredited school unit. The commissioner, with the approval of the State Board of Education, shall establish requirements for accreditation which include quality of instruction, curriculum and school facilities. The commissioner shall appoint an advisory committee of professional and lay persons to assist in the development of these standards.

Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act shall become effective July 1, 1969.

Effective July 1, 1969
