Chapter 172

AN ACT Providing Funds to Assist the Casco Bay Island Development Association to Create an International Vacation and Conference Center on Peaks Island.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Funds. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$5,000 to the Casco Bay Island Development Association to assist in administrative expenses necessary in contacting business concerns, charitable foundations and agencies of the Federal Government to raise funds for the establishment of an International Vacation and Conference Center on Peaks Island in the City of Portland.

Effective October 7, 1967

Chapter 173

AN ACT Providing Funds for a Redevelopment Plan of the Portland and South Portland Waterfront.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Funds. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$30,000 to the Greater Portland Chamber of Commerce, to aid in securing a redevelopment plan for the waterfront of Portland and South Portland. Such appropriation shall not be available until a like amount has been realized from voluntary subscriptions provided by the Greater Portland Chamber of Commerce.

Chapter 174

AN ACT Providing Funds for Relocating of Maine Central Railroad Tracks in Livermore Falls.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated to the Town of Livermore Falls from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$15,000 to help defray the cost of relocating the Maine Central Railroad tracks in order to eliminate 2 grade crossings on Main and Depot Streets in said Livermore Falls.
