CHAP. 16

Chapter 13

RESOLVE, Closing to Fishing that Portion of the Thoroughfare, So Called, Between Nesowadnehunk (Sourdnahunk) Lake and Outlet Dam, Piscataquis County.

Fishing in Piscataquis County regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close to all fishing for the years 1968 and 1969 that portion of the thoroughfare, so called, between Nesowadnehunk (Sourdnahunk) Lake and the dam, northerly from the dam for an approximate distance of 1,000 feet to red posts set on the shore of said thoroughfare of Nesowadnehunk Lake (Sourdnahunk).

Effective October 7, 1967

Chapter 14

RESOLVE, Establishing Bag Limit of Trout on Little Nesowadnehunk (Sourdnahunk) Lake, Piscataquis County.

Fishing in Little Nesowadnehunk (Sourdnahunk) Lake; regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to establish on Little Nesowadnehunk (Sourdnahunk) Lake in T5 R11, Piscataquis County, a daily bag and possession limit of one trout.

Effective October 7, 1967

Chapter 15

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing, Wassookeag Lake, Penobscot County.

Wassookeag Lake; fishing regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close to fishing by all means, so much of the waters of Wassookeag Lake as are contained in an area easterly and westerly of the Guy H. Hall Memorial Bridge, and on all shores extending from said bridge, for a distance of 150 feet, easterly and westerly, measured on a line perpendicular to the center of said bridge, for and during the month of September of each year.

Chapter 16

RESOLVE, for Laying of the County Taxes for the Years Nineteen Hundred Sixty-Seven and Nineteen Hundred Sixty-Eight.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the several counties hereinafter named have certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due; and
