Chapter 17

RESOLVE, Designating U. S. Route No. 1-A in Maine as a Blue Star Memorial Highway.

Resolves, 1947, c. 125, amended. **Resolved:** That the first paragraph of chapter 125 of the resolves of 1947 is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

That U. S. Route 1 and U. S. Route 1-A starting at the junction of Routes 1-A and 1 in Stockton Springs and extending via Bangor and Brewer to the junction of Routes 1-A and 1 in Ellsworth, in Maine be designated as the Blue Star Memorial Highway; and be it further

Chapter 18

RESOLVE, Relating to Ice Fishing on Fourth Musquacook Lake, T10, R11, T11, R11, Aroostook County.

Resolves, 1965, c. 25, amended. **Resolved:** That that part of rule and regulation 1 of chapter 25 of the resolves of 1965 which relates to Fourth Musquacook Lake is repealed, as follows:

~~Fourth Musquacook Lake, T11 R11;~~ and be it further

Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close Fourth Musquacook Lake in T10, R11, T11, R11, to ice fishing.

Chapter 19

RESOLVE, to Change the Name of Long Pond, Sandy River Plantation, Franklin County, to Beaver Mountain Lake.

Long Pond, name changed. **Resolved:** That the name of the pond in Sandy River Plantation, Franklin County, heretofore known as Long Pond, is hereby changed to Beaver Mountain Lake.
