CHAP, 56

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Effective July 1, 1967

Chapter 54

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Town of Hanover for Aid Extended Floyd Merrill.

Town of Hanover; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$475 to be paid to the Town of Hanover to reimburse the town for support of Floyd Merrill.

Effective October 7, 1967

Chapter 55

RESOLVE, Providing for Purchase of One Hundred Copies of "Pittsfield on the Sebasticook".

Pittsfield on the Sebasticook; purchase of. Resolved: That the State purchase 100 copies of the book entitled "Pittsfield on the Sebasticook" by Sanger Mills Cook at \$5 per copy; said books to be exchanged or distributed at the discretion of the State Librarian; and be it further

Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$500 for this purpose.

Effective October 7, 1967

Chapter 56

RESOLVE, in Favor of Herbert Parsons of Gorham.

Herbert Parsons; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$642.90, to be paid to Herbert Parsons of Gorham, as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State for destruction of his car by an escapee from the Men's Reformatory at Windham.
