Chapter 82

AN ACT Relating to Payment to Commissioner of Agriculture of Dog License Fees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 7, § 3452, amended. The first sentence of section 3452 of Title 7 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

The clerks of cities and towns shall issue said licenses, receive the money therefor and pay the same to the Treasurer of State Commissioner of Agriculture, who shall credit the same to the General Fund.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 7, § 3453, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 3453 of Title 7 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

The dog recorder shall issue licenses, receive the money therefor and pay the same to the Treasurer of State Commissioner of Agriculture who shall credit the same to the General Fund. Such recorders shall keep a record of all licenses issued by them, with the names of the owners or keepers of dogs licensed and the sex, registered numbers and descriptions of all such dogs. The sex, registered number and description shall not be required of dogs covered by a kennel license.

Chapter 83

AN ACT Relating to Privileges and Appurtenances in Short Form Deeds.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 33, § 773, amended. Section 773 of Title 33 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 377 of the public laws of 1967, is amended to read as follows:

§ 773. Easements, privileges and appurtenances belonging to granted estate

In a conveyance of real estate all rights, easements, privileges and appurtenances belonging to the granted estate shall be enumerated included in the conveyance, unless the contrary shall be stated in the deed.
