#### Chapter 262

#### AN ACT Amending the Marriage Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 19, § 1, amended. The first 2 sentences of section 1 of Title 19 of the Revised Statutes are amended to read as follows:

Marriages solemnized among Quakers or Friends, in the form heretofore practiced in their meeting, or solemnized among members of the Baha'i faith according to the rules and principles of the Baha'i faith, are valid and not affected by subchapters II to IV subchapter V. The clerk or the keeper of the records of the meeting or ceremony in which they are solemnized shall make return thereof as provided in Title 22, section 2802.

Effective October 1, 1969

#### Chapter 263

AN ACT Relating to Cost of Replacement Motor Vehicles as Damages in Civil Actions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 14, § 1454, additional. Title 14 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 1454, to read as follows:

#### § 1454. Cost of replacement motor vehicles

In any action where recovery is sought for the destruction or damage of a motor vehicle, the owner of such motor vehicle shall be entitled to recover reasonable rental costs actually expended for a replacement motor vehicle during such time, not to exceed 30 days, as the damaged motor vehicle could not be operated or during such time, not to exceed 30 days, as is required to obtain a replacement motor vehicle for the destroyed motor vehicle.
