Chapter 8

RESOLVE, Authorizing Attorney General to Convey-Interest of the State in Certain Lands in Cumberland County.

Resolves, 1957, c. 46, amended. Resolved: That chapter 46 of the resolves of 1957 is amended to read as follows:

Authorizing the Attorney General to convey certain lands. Resolved: That the Attorney General be, and hereby is, authorized to convey by quitclaim deed the interest of the State in the lands included in the area on the shore of Little Sebago Lake in the County of Cumberland, which lands lie in whole or in part between the ancient low water mark as established by the common law and the present low water mark of said lake, to such persons as shall have on the effective date of this resolve deeds and conveyances of record purporting to convey to them title to such lands.

Chapter 9

RESOLVE, Regulating Ice Fishing on Indian, Orange, Rocky and Sunken Lakes in Washington County.

Ice fishing on Indian, Orange, Rocky and Sunken Lakes; regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to open Indian Lake, Whiting Township; Orange Lake, Whiting Township; Rocky Lake, Marion, Edmunds and Whiting Townships; and Sunken Lake, Whiting and Marion Townships, in the County of Washington, to ice fishing during February and March of each year.

Chapter 10

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Forest Commissioner to Study the Laws, Rules and Regulations Relating to Logs and Lumber.

Study of laws, rules and regulations relating to logs and lumber; authorized. Resolved: That the State Forest Commissioner is authorized and directed to make a study for purposes of revision of those laws, rules and regulations contained in the Revised Statutes, Title 30, chapter 225, pertaining to logs and lumber.
