Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, now, therefore, be it

Fishing in Robbins Pond, regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Robbins Pond, Aroostook County, to fishing with artificial flies only and establishing a 5-fish daily bag limit.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Resolve shall take effect when approved.

Effective April 14, 1969

Chapter 14

RESOLVE, in Favor of Dan S. Webb of Wilton.

Dan S. Webb; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Dog Tax Fund the sum of \$250 to be paid to Dan S. Webb of Wilton, as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State for a cow and calf killed by bear.

Effective October 1, 1969

Chapter 15

RESOLVE, in Favor of Robert Huntington and Floyd Richardson of Turner for Damage by Bears.

Robert Huntington and Floyd Richardson; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated to Robert Huntington and Floyd Richardson of Turner, from the Dog License Fund, the sum of \$400 for damage caused by bear to colony of bees.
