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Sec. 2. R. S., T. 29, § 891, amended. Section 891 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by inserting after the first sentence of the 3rd paragraph the following new sentence:

The absence of notice having been given to the nearest state police field office or to the sheriff's office within the county wherein the accident occurred or the office of the police department of the municipality wherein the accident occurred shall be deemed prima facie evidence of a violation of this section.

#### Chapter 135

#### AN ACT Increasing Salaries of District Court Judges.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 4 § 157, amended. The 4th sentence of section 157 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes, as last amended by section 3 of chapter 580 of the public laws of 1969, is further amended to read as follows:

Each judge shall receive an annual salary of \$16,000 \$19,500 and the Chief Judge shall receive an annual salary of \$17,000 \$20,500.

### Chapter 136

AN ACT Relating to Transfer of Liquor License When There Is a Change in Minority Ownership.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 203, amended. The first paragraph of section 203 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end the following new sentence:

If said licensee shall sell, transfer or assign a minority interest in the property or premises to which a license has been granted, then if the majority stockholder or partner remains the same as in the original license issued, the commission shall issue a new license upon the payment of a \$10 transfer fee.
