Chapter 305

AN ACT Eliminating Restriction on Unemployment Benefits for Military Retirees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 26, § 1193, sub-§ 5, ¶ C, amended. Paragraph C of subsection 5 of section 1193 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 17 of chapter 381 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended to read as follows:
 - C. Retirement pay or a pension paid, excluding a pension paid under Title II of the Federal Social Security Act, as amended, and further excluding retirement, disability, retainer or pension payments received as a result of service in the Armed Forces of the United States, directly by the employer or paid indirectly by the employer through a trust fund, insurance or other media in the manner set forth in section 1043, subsection 19, paragraph B, subparagraph (1).

Chapter 306

AN ACT to Clarify the Law Relating to Nonvoters Speaking at Town Meetings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 2054, sub-§ 3, ¶ A, amended. Paragraph A of subsection 3 of section 2054 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding after the first sentence a new sentence to read as follows:

A person not a voter in the town may speak at the meeting only with consent of $\frac{2}{3}$ of the voters present.

Chapter 307

AN ACT to Correct an Ambiguity in Procedure for Recording Municipal Charters and Amendments.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 1916, repealed and replaced. Section 1916 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 563 of the public laws of 1969, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:
