Any balances at June 30, 1971 of this Act shall carry forward until the purposes for which the appropriations are made shall be accomplished.

Chapter 26

AN ACT Appropriating Funds for World Cup Races at Sugarloaf in 1971.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, skiing is one of Maine's fastest growing recreational activities and should be encouraged; and

Whereas, Maine is indeed fortunate to have scheduled the World Cup Races at Sugarloaf this winter; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to aid in defraying the expenses of this world renowned event; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to Sugarloaf, Inc. the sum of \$25,000 to provide for the State's participation in bringing the World Cup Races to Sugarloaf in the winter of 1971.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 27

AN ACT to Authorize Augusta Water District and Augusta Sanitary District to Exchange Customer Accounting Records.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1903, c. 334, § 11-A, additional. Chapter 334 of the private and special laws of 1903, as amended, is further amended by adding a new section 11-A, to read as follows:

Sec. 11-A. Customer accounting records. The officers of this district are authorized from time to time to furnish to and to receive from Augusta Sanitary District customer accounting records and information of each party to be used in connection with calculation of rates, billings and other financial requirements of the district and to pay and receive fair charges therefor.

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1955, c. 139, § 22, additional. Chapter 139 of the private and special laws of 1955, as amended, is further amended by adding a new section 22, to read as follows:

Sec. 22. Customer accounting records. The officers of this district are authorized from time to time to furnish to and to receive from Augusta Water District customer accounting records and information of each party to be used in connection with calculation of rates, billings and other financial requirements of the district and to pay and receive fair charges therefor.
