Sec. 68-B. Taking of smelts in Eastern River. The Eastern River in the Town of Dresden is closed to all smelt fishing, except by hook and line.

Effective September 23, 1971

Chapter 48

AN ACT Relating to Trustees and Executive Committee of Lincoln Academy.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Lincoln Academy Charter; amended. The last sentence of section 5 of the charter of Lincoln Academy, in Newcastle, incorporated by private and special act of the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, passed February 23, 1801, and as last amended by section 1 of chapter 227 of the private and special laws of 1965, is further amended to read as follows:

Seven Eight trustees shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Sec. 2. Lincoln Academy Charter; amended. The 2nd sentence of section 6 of the charter of Lincoln Academy, in Newcastle, incorporated by private and special act of the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, passed February 23, 1801, and as last amended by section 3 of chapter 17 of the private and special laws of 1961, is further amended to read as follows:

The executive committee shall consist of the officers, the immediate past president and 3 members.

Chapter 49

AN ACT Authorizing Use of the Name Maine Association of Real Estate Boards.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Authority to use name. The Maine Association of Real Estate Boards is granted the authority to use the name "Maine Association of Real Estate Boards" as an association or corporation.
