Chapter 78

AN ACT Relating to Name Maine Yacht Racing Association, Inc.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Change of name. The name of Pine Tree Yacht Racing Association, Inc., a corporation organized under the Maine Revised Statutes of 1964, Title 13, chapter 81, is changed to Maine Yacht Racing Association, Inc.

Sec. 2. Copy to be recorded. A copy of this Act shall be recorded in the records of the Secretary of State and a copy in the registry of deeds of Cumberland County.

Chapter 79

AN ACT Creating the Rumford-Mexico Sewerage District.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the communities of Rumford and Mexico are in great need of installation of a joint sewage treatment system; and

Whereas, it is essential that maximum state and federal matching funds be available for such a project; and

Whereas, it is vital that construction of such an installation be commenced at the earliest possible opportunity in order to minimize pollution problems on the Androscoggin River; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Definitions. Unless the context specifically indicates otherwise, the meaning of terms used in this charter shall be as follows:

1. District. "District" shall mean the Rumford and Mexico Sewerage District.

2. Joint use. "Joint use" shall mean those facilities which are used in common by both Rumford and Mexico to accommodate sewage flows from both towns.

3. Person. "Person" shall mean any individual, firm, company, association, society, corporation or group.
