Chapter 114

AN ACT to Make Allocations from Bond Issue for Construction, Planning and Equipment of Pollution Abatement Facilities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Allocation. From the proceeds of the sale of bonds for planning, construction and equipment of pollution abatement facilities, from July 1, 1971 to June 30, 1972 and from July 1, 1972 to June 30, 1973, there shall be segregated, apportioned and expended as designated in the following schedule:

Any unexpended balance shall not lapse, but shall be carried forward from year to year to be expended for the same purposes.

Chapter 115

AN ACT Making Additional Appropriations for the Expenditures of State Government for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 1971.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the said 90-day period will not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses necessary to the operation of the Department of Health and Welfare will become due and payable before July 1, 1971; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriations for necessary expenditures of government. In order to provide for the necessary expenditures of government and for other purposes for the month of June the following sums or as much thereof as shall severally be found necessary, as designated in the following tabulation, are appropriated out of any moneys in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund not otherwise appropriated or provided by law. Upon receipt of allot-

ments duly approved by the Governor and Council based upon work programs submitted to the State Budget Officer, the State Controller shall authorize expenditures of these appropriations and revenues accruing thereto, together with expenditures for other purposes necessary to the conduct of State Government on the basis of such allotments and not otherwise.

Any balances at June 30, 1971 of this Act shall carry forward until the purposes for which the appropriations are made shall be accomplished.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 116

AN ACT to Establish a Maine Library Advisory Committee.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Maine Library Advisory Committee. The Governor shall appoint a Maine Library Advisory Committee consisting of 7 members, 4 to be selected upon combined recommendation of Maine Library Association, Maine School Library Association and Maine Library Trustees Association. Terms shall expire upon adjournment of the 106th Legislature. In case of the termination of a member's service during his term, the Governor shall appoint a successor for the unexpired term under the same conditions as the original appointment. Members shall serve without compensation but shall, receive their necessary expenses. Serving as nonvoting, ex officio members shall be the State Librarian and the presidents or representatives of the Maine Library Association, Maine School Library Association and Maine Library Trustees Association.
