Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 116

AN ACT to Establish a Maine Library Advisory Committee.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Maine Library Advisory Committee. The Governor shall appoint a Maine Library Advisory Committee consisting of 7 members, 4 to be selected upon combined recommendation of Maine Library Association, Maine School Library Association and Maine Library Trustees Association. Terms shall expire upon adjournment of the 106th Legislature. In case of the termination of a member's service during his term, the Governor shall appoint a successor for the unexpired term under the same conditions as the original appointment. Members shall serve without compensation but shall, receive their necessary expenses. Serving as nonvoting, ex officio members shall be the State Librarian and the presidents or representatives of the Maine Library Association, Maine School Library Association and Maine Library Trustees Association.

The committee shall meet and organize and the members shall elect from among themselves a chairman and a secretary.

Sec. 2. Duties. The duties of the committee shall be:

- 1. To review the studies and recommendations of the Governor's Task Force to Study Library Services;
 - To study existing library laws;
- 3. To review standards for all types of libraries in conjunction with the appropriate professional groups;
 - 4. To examine the "Standards for Library Functions at the State Level;"
 - 5. To study the changing functions of libraries;
- 6. To study the funding necessary to support library services adequately; and
- 7. To propose a state-wide plan for library development and recommend legislation to the 106th Legislature to implement the plan.

Chapter 117

AN ACT Making Supplemental Appropriations for the Expenditures of State Government and for Other Purposes for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1972 and June 30, 1973 and Raising Revenue for Funding Thereof.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and Resolves passed by the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the said 90-day period will not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of departments and institutions will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1971; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriations for necessary expenditures of government. In order to provide for necessary expenditures of government and for other purposes for the
