CHAPTER 171

AN ACT Appropriating Funds to Carry out Duties of the Director of Legislative Research.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the duties and functions of the Director of Legislative Research are a direct obligation of the State; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to provide for the distribution of the laws enacted by the first special session of the 105th Legislature; and

Whereas, it is vital that the people of Maine be informed as to such laws enacted by their duly elected representatives; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Research Committee the sum of \$11,500 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

CHAPTER 172

AN ACT Appropriating Funds to Survey the Boundaries of Passamaquoddy Tribal Lands.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Survey of boundaries of Passamaquoddy tribal lands; appropriation. There is appropriated the sum of \$2,000 from the Unappropriated Surplus of the

General Fund to the account of the Pleasant Point Passamaquoddy Reservation Housing Authority for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1973, for the purpose of surveying the boundaries of the Passamaquoddy tribal lands. Any funds not expended at the end of the fiscal year shall lapse and not be carried forward. The breakdown shall be as follows:

CHAPTER 173

AN ACT Providing Funds for Maine Historical Society.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, previous Legislatures have appropriated funds to establish a manuscript section within the Maine Historical Society; and

Whereas, to prevent deterioration of such section and to provide primary sources of Maine students and to train people in this very important work, the following legislation is vitally necessary; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to the Maine Historical Society for operating expenses, the sum of \$14,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1972 and \$14,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1973.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

CHAPTER 174

AN ACT Providing Funds to Town of Mattawamkeag to Construct Municipal Buildings Destroyed by Fire.
