CHAPTER 25

AN ACT Relating to Designation of an Official in Absence or Disability of Town Manager.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 2314, amended. The first sentence of section 2314 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 438 of the public laws of 1969, is amended to read as follows:

The town manager may designate a qualified administrative official of the municipality to perform his duties during his temporary absence or disability, subject to confirmation by the board of selectmen.

CHAPTER 26

AN ACT Relating to Penalty for Not Having a License Issued under Fish and Game Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 3060, sub-§ 4, additional. Section 3060 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding a new subsection 4 to read as follows:

4. Lack of license. Whoever is convicted of not having a license issued under chapters 301 to 335 shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$20, plus the cost of a license fee for such activity.

CHAPTER 27

AN ACT Repealing the Prohibition Against Mobile Home Sales on Sunday.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 17, § 3203, amended. The first sentence of section 3203 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
