CHAPTER 53

AN ACT Relating to Motor Vehicle Auxiliary Lights on Snow Plowing Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 1368, sub-§ 3, amended. Subsection 3 of section 1368 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 155 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended by adding a new paragraph to read as follows:

Vehicles equipped and used for plowing snow on other than public ways may be equipped with an auxiliary rotary flashing light, which shall be mounted on top of the vehicle in such a manner as to emit an amber beam of light over a 360° angle. Such lighting shall only be in use on a public way when the vehicle is entering in or upon such public ways in the course of plowing private driveways and other off-highway locations.

Effective October 3, 1973

CHAPTER 54

AN ACT Relating to Display of Headlamps on Parked Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 1071, amended. Section 1071 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read as follows:

No vehicle, unless municipal ordinance specifically provides otherwise, shall be parked on or beside the left-hand side of a way or street during the times when lighted lamps are required in such a manner that the lighted headlamps of such vehicle project in the direction of oncoming traffic.

CHAPTER 55

AN ACT Relating to Exemption of Certain Securities and Dealers from Registration under the Securities Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 32, § 807, additional. Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 807 to read as follows:
