Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 32, § 4052, amended. Section 4052 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 2 of chapter 359 of the public laws of 1967, is further amended to read as follows:

§ 4052. Compensation

Each member of the commission shall receive as full compensation for each day actually spent on the work of said commission the sum of \$25 \$35 and his actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of duties pertaining to his office.

CHAPTER 60

AN ACT Relating to the Use of Separate Ballot Box for Constitutional Amendments and Referenda.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 21, § 706, sub-§ 5, amended. The first sentence of subsection 5 of section 706 of Title 21 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

A municipality having 7,500 or more inhabitants shall, and one with fewer inhabitants may, by vote of its municipal officers, authorize separate ballot boxes at elections for deposit of votes on constitutional amendments and referenda

CHAPTER 61

AN ACT Relating to Penalty for Sale of Liquor in Violation of Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 1051, amended. The last sentence of section 1051 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500, and costs, and in addition thereto by imprisonment for not less than 2 months nor more than 6 months and in default of payment of fine and costs, by imprisonment for 6 months additional.
