CHAPTER 192

AN ACT Relating to Liquor Licensee Records.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 28, § 351, amended. The last sentence of the first paragraph of section 351 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

All such records shall be open to the commission ~~or~~, its representatives or representatives of the Bureau of Liquor Enforcement of the Department of Public Safety at any time and the commission ~~or~~, its representatives or representatives of said Bureau of Liquor Enforcement shall have the right to make copies thereof which may be used as evidence of violation of this section.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 28, § 351, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 351 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

No licensee shall refuse the commission ~~or~~, its representatives or representatives of said Bureau of Liquor Enforcement the right at any time completely to inspect the entire licensed premises or to audit the books and records of the licensee.

CHAPTER 193

AN ACT Permitting Sale of Prepackaged Foods in Taverns.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 2, sub-§ 22, amended. The first sentence of subsection 22 of section 2 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

“Tavern” shall mean a reputable place for men only operated by responsible persons where no food is sold, other than prepared packaged foods, bar snacks, and no business is carried on except the sale of cigarettes and tobacco products and except the sale of malt liquor at a bar.

Effective October 3, 1973
