CHAPTER 190

AN ACT Relating to Meals Provided for Employees of the Department of Mental Health and Corrections.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

5 MRSA § 8-C, 1st ¶, as last amended by PL 1975, c. 777, § 4, is amended by adding at the end 2 new sentences to read:

With the approval of the Commissioner of Mental Health and Corrections and the head of the institution involved, no charge shall be made for the provision of meals to any state employee who eats such meals within the scope of his employment and in doing so serves a function of his employment. If such approval is given, the Commissioner of Mental Health and Corrections shall establish standards which shall be applied uniformly at all institutions within the department.

CHAPTER 191

AN ACT to Permit the Use of Salmon Eggs for Fishing Bait.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA § 2705 is enacted to read:

§ 2705. Salmon eggs for bait

Nothing in this Title shall prohibit the use of the eggs of either Atlantic sea run salmon or landlocked salmon for bait.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA § 2751-A, 1st ¶, last sentence, as repealed and replaced by PL 1973, c. 562, § 27, is amended to read:

This shall not apply to tropical fish which are for aquarium purposes, except piranhas, walking catfish and white amur (grass carp) nor to the chemically preserved eggs of either the Atlantic sea run salmon or landlocked salmon.

Effective October 24, 1977
