**Sec. 3.** Effective date. Section 2 of this Act shall become effective 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

## CHAPTER 708 H. P. 1618 – L. D. 1728

AN ACT to Increase the License Fee under the Maine Coastal Protection Fund.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

38 MRSA § 551, sub-§ 4, ¶A, as repealed and replaced by PL 1977, c. 375, § 13, is amended to read:

A. License fees shall be determined on the basis of  $\frac{1}{2e}$  1¢ per barrel of oil transferred by the licensee during the licensing period and shall be paid monthly by the licensee on the basis of records certified to the board, provided that during such time as any bonds issued pursuant to the private and special laws of 1969, chapter 239, shall remain outstanding and funds made available for interest and debt retirement shall be inadequate for such purpose, the license fee shall be determined on the basis of  $\frac{1.0e}{2e}$  per barrel. License fees shall be paid to the board and upon receipt by it credited to the Maine Coastal Protection Fund.

#### CHAPTER 709 S. P. 780 – L. D. 1972

#### AN ACT to Amend the Maine Guarantee Authority Act.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
