Department of Commerce or predecessor or successor agency control points and purporting to define the position of a point on a land boundary may be presented to be recorded in any public land records or deed records, unless the survey method used for the determination of these coordinates is specifically described on the record plan or description of the survey.

§ 807. Use of terms

The use of the "Maine Coordinate System of 1927 East Zone," "Maine Coordinate System of 1983 East Zone," "Maine Coordinate System of 1927 West Zone" or "Maine Coordinate System of 1983 West Zone" on any map, report of survey, or other document shall be limited to coordinates based on the Maine Coordinate System as defined in this chapter.

§ 807-A. Effective date

The Maine Coordinate System of 1927 shall not be used after December 31, 1989; the Maine Coordinate System of 1983 will be the sole system after this date.

CHAPTER 157

S. P. 103 - L. D. 216

AN ACT to Adopt a Lead Emission Standard under the Laws for Protection and Improvement of Air.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

38 MRSA § 584-A, sub-§ 7 is enacted to read:

7. Lead. The maximum 24-hour lead concentration at any location shall be 1.5 micrograms per cubic meter, which standard may be exceeded once per year.
