CHAPTER 44

H.P. 376 - L.D. 459

RESOLVE, Appropriating \$15,000 for Maine
Poison Control Center.

Appropriation. Resolved: That the following
funds shall be appropriated from the General Fund to
carry out the purposes of this resolve.

CHAPTER 45

H.P. 420 - L.D. 503

RESOLVE, Directing the Department of
Marine Resources to Erect a Fishway on the
Orange River in Whiting, Washington County.

Commissioner of Marine Resources to erect fish-
way. Resolved: That in the event that sufficient
public or private funds are available, the Commis-
sioner of Marine Resources is directed to cause the
construction of a fishway at the Crane Mill Dam on
the Orange River in Whiting, Washington County.

CHAPTER 46

S.P. 324 - L.D. 969

RESOLVE, Authorizing and Directing the
Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and
Rural Resources to Promote Regional
and International Cooperation in the
Development of Agricultural Programs De-
signed to Encourage Greater Food Production,
Marketing and Food Self-sufficiency Among
the States of New England
and Quebec and the Maritimes.
