§195. Annual reports

It shall be the duty of each said the county extension association, annually, on or before the 10th day of Becember as required, to present its plan of extension work for the ensuing year and to render to both the trustees of the University of Maine, Cellege of Agriculture, at Orono and the county commissioners a full detailed report of its extension activities for the preceding fiscal year, including a detailed report of its receipts and expenditures from all sources. The financial report of such county extension association shall be on such forms as may be prescribed by the trustees of the University of Maine, Cellege of Agriculture at Orono and the county commissioners.

CHAPTER 284

S.P. 590 - L.D. 1553

AN ACT Concerning Unauthorized Transfer and Use of Fuel Obtained Through Fuel Assistance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

22 MRSA §5206 is enacted to read:

§5206. Penalty

Whoever knowingly uses, transfers, acquires or possesses fuel, provided through fuel assistance, in any manner not authorized by this chapter or the rules issued under this chapter shall be guilty of a Class E crime.
