H.P. 385 - L.D. 617

Resolve, to Rename a Bridge in the Town of Waterboro the Waterboro Veterans Memorial Bridge

Sec. 1. Bridge in Waterboro renamed. Resolved: That the Department of Transportation shall designate Bridge 3830 on Main Street in the Town of Waterboro, which crosses Hamilton Brook and is currently known as the School Bridge, the Waterboro Veterans Memorial Bridge.

CHAPTER 19

H.P. 492 - L.D. 750

Resolve, Regarding Legislative Review of Portions of Chapter 27: Standards for Timber Harvesting and Timber Harvesting Related Activities Within Unorganized and Deorganized Areas of the State, a Major Substantive Rule of the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Forestry

Sec. 1. Adoption. Resolved: That final adoption of portions of Chapter 27: Standards for Timber Harvesting and Timber Harvesting Related Activities Within Unorganized and Deorganized Areas of the State, a provisionally adopted major substantive rule of the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Bureau of Forestry that has been submitted to the Legislature for review pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A, is authorized as long as the effective date of the rule is January 1, 2026.

S.P. 362 - L.D. 796

Resolve, to Rename a Bridge in Windham and Gorham the Little Falls Veterans Memorial Bridge

Sec. 1. Bridge in Windham and Gorham renamed. Resolved: That the Department of Transportation shall designate Bridge 2787 on Route 202, which crosses the Presumpscot River between the Town of Windham and the Town of Gorham and is currently known as the South Windham Bridge, the Little Falls Veterans Memorial Bridge.

CHAPTER 21

H.P. 54 - L.D. 90

Resolve, Regarding Legislative Review of Chapter 6: Delegation of Nursing Activities and Tasks to Unlicensed Assistive Personnel by Registered Professional Nurses, a Major Substantive Rule of the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, State Board of Nursing

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A requires legislative authorization before major substantive agency rules may be finally adopted by the agency; and

Whereas, a major substantive rule has been submitted to the Legislature for review; and

Whereas, immediate enactment of this resolve is necessary to record the Legislature's position on final adoption of the rule; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it
