The Joint Standing Committee on Business Legislation requests permission to carry over LD 1581 "AN ACT to Reform the Pharmacy Laws" to the Second Session of the 113th Legislature.

LD 1581 was not referenced to the Committee until May 15. It is a 40 page redraft of a bill which was before the Committee last year and was very controversial. The Committee held a public hearing on May 26 of this year and testimony indicated that substantial issues continue to exist.

The Board of Commissioners of the Profession of Pharmacy is scheduled to be reviewed this year by the Committee on Audit and Program Review. This fact and the short time that the Committee has had this session to deal with this complex bill are the reasons for our request to hold over LD 1581.
