Undermanning in the Bureau of Elections; Public Administration

Division.

At the last minute the Part II Budget replaced the loss of two people of the four people earlier taken from the Public Administration Division. These two were allocated and specifically directed to the Corporation Bureau, so please don't confuse them with the two positions earlier taken from the Elections Bureau.

Within the Elections Bureau the original staff of 3 experienced people has evaporated and we have only one ballot room employee authorized. She is retiring July 31st. Add lack of expertise to shortage of people.

The attached list of tasks for this election year illustrates our problem.

- A. We serve over 700 voting districts and the November referendum requires a substantial amount of effort on our part, added to the two special legislative elections and a special referendum in Washington County.
- B. Recent changes in the election law, especially regarding absentee ballots, have required the reprinting and distribution of various forms, envelopes, etc.
- C. Newly approved voting devices in many districts require special printing of ballots -- a technique to be learned by our staff.
- D. Our computer which produces mailing labels for all election material must be updated and programs must be modified.
- E. Because of reduced storage space in the ballot room, additional physical effort must be expended to remove, categorize and restore our materials.

SUGGESTED SHORT-RANGE SOLUTION:

please consider loaning me for the next four months the two experienced employees who were transferred to the Legislature for engrossing work. There is no engrossing now and they are skilled and experienced in elections. We can then approach the 2nd session of the Legislature next year for a more permanent solution.
