The Committee had then reviewed the other applicants and decided to invite Mr. David Kennedy, who had been one of the finalists for the position of Director, Office of Policy and Legal Analysis, to return for a second interview, for the position of Revisor. Mr. Kennedy had originally submitted applications for both positions. Rep. Martin presented the unanimous recommendation of the Committee to the Council to offer the position of Revisor to Mr. Kennedy.
