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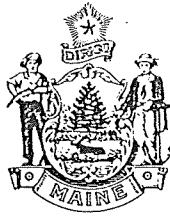

Dear President Pray:

Recent legislation enacted during the Second Regular Session of the 113th Legislature required the Superintendent of Insurance to promulgate rules to define the language requirements of the form used to provide for written informed consent for persons required to take the HIV test prior to purchasing insurance. The Superintendent of the Bureau of Insurance has proposed rules concerning written informed consent and pretest and post-test counseling. A public hearing by the Bureau of Insurance has been scheduled for comments on the proposed rules on Wednesday, September 28, 1988.

The legislative hearing was conducted by the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources. The Legislation, however, involves the Superintendent of Insurance. Accordingly, the subject matter of this public hearing concerns both the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources and the Joint Standing Committee on Banking and Insurance. Accordingly, we request permission to schedule a joint meeting for both committees on Wednesday, September 14, 1988 to discuss the proposed rules and their conformity to legislative intent.


